#10 Introduction to Apologetics: John shows why we all need to be as well prepared as possible to discuss, defend, and share our faith with others. He gives you several basic principles to use when discussing the faith with anyone...non-Catholics as well as Catholics.

#11 Apologetics for the Scripturally-Challenged: Basic apologetics strategies that anyone can use to engage in evangelization and apologetics. No need to ever be afraid of talking about the Bible and the Catholic Faith again. Plus, "12 Questions for Protestants".

#12 Apostolic Authority and the Pope: Who is the Pope? Is there biblical backing for the office of the Pope? What kind of authority does the Pope have? From the Bible - why we have a Pope and a Magisterium. Also includes the history of where we got the Bible.

#13 Catholics and the Bible: How should Catholics read the Bible? What guidelines should they use? Are there errors in the Bible? Do Catholics take the Bible literally? Were Adam and Eve real people? What does the Church teach about bible study and interpretation.

#14 The Communion of Saints: What is the Communion of Saints? Can we pray to Mary? To the Saints? What does the Bible say about that? Are we going behind Jesus' back when we pray to the Saints? What does the Bible mean when it says that Jesus is the sole mediator between God and man?

#15 Introduction to Apologetics: John shows why we all need to be as well prepared as possible to discuss, defend, and share our faith with others. He gives you several basic principles to use when discussing the faith with anyone...non-Catholics as well as Catholics.

#16 Marriage and the Eucharist: The Two Shall Become One: Draws some fascinating parallels between these two sacraments, and then uses these parallels to explain the Church's teaching on such topics as sex outside of marriage, contraception, and non-Catholics receiving the Eucharist. Also includes an interesting discussion on homosexual "marriage."

#17 Mary and the Bible; Purgatory: The Church's teachings regarding Mary (the Immaculate Conception, the Assumption, perpetual virginity, etc.) do indeed have scriptural support. Plus a few minutes on Purgatory and the Bible.

#18 My Conversion Story: John's personal faith journey. He talks about growing up Catholic and then leaving the Faith when he went off to college. You'll learn about what brought him back to the Faith and how he came to be so involved in apologetics.

#19 Once Saved. Always Saved? If you accept Jesus Christ into your heart as your personal Lord and Savior, do you have "absolute assurance" of salvation, no matter how much you sin after that? Shows that this doctrine is actually a perversion of what the Bible teaches.

#20 One Church: Does it matter which church you go to...as long as it's Christian? You bet it does! John shows, from the Bible, that Jesus did not intend for there to be 25,000+ churches and denominations - that there is one, and only one, Church.

#21 The Rapture and the Bible: Compares Catholic teaching on the "Rapture" and on the end times, with the Protestant teaching on the same subjects. John shows, using only the Bible, that the Rapture theology that is so prevalent among Protestant denominations and which has been popularized by the "Left Behind" series of books and movies, is a gross distortion of what is actually taught in the Bible.

#22 The Sacraments and the Bible - Baptism, Confession, and the Eucharist: Biblical foundations for Catholic teaching on each of these three sacraments, with half of the tape devoted to the Eucharist. Shows how the Bible supports Catholic teaching or all three of these Sacraments and why Protestant teaching on these Sacraments just doesn't stand up to scriptural scrutiny.

#23 Sola Fide - Salvation By Faith Alone? Are we saved by Faith Alone, as many Protestants believe? Or, do both faith and works play an important role in our salvation? John presents the Protestant argument, from Scripture, then, using the Bible alone, thoroughly demolishes it while presenting Scripture passage after Scripture passage that support Catholic teaching.

#24 Sola Scriptura - The Bible Alone? Protestants believe in the Bible as the sole rule of faith for Christians. Using the Bible alone, John shows that this doctrine, Sola Scriptura, is not scriptural; in fact, it is actually opposed to what is taught in Scripture. John also talks about where we got the Bible and responds to several myths commonly taught among non-Catholics about the Catholic Church and the Bible. He also clears up the question about the Catholic Church "adding" seven books to the Bible.

#25 Two-Minute Apologetics: 19 different topics in short Q&A format. Why do Catholics call their priests "Father?" Do Catholics take the Bible literally? Why do we keep Jesus hanging on the Cross? Were Adam and Eve myths? Have Catholics been "born again?" And 14 more. If you want quick answers to common questions asked of Catholics, here they are.

#26 Which Came First, the Church or the Bible? Many Christians seem to believe the Church is almost irrelevant. That we don't need the Church because we have the Bible. This talk very clearly shows, however, that we can have the Church without the Bible, but we can't have the Bible without the Church. It shows that it was impossible for the first Christians to believe in going by the Bible alone, because they didn't have the Bible.
