Recent Highlights and Achievements

Over 4800 Christian service hours were performed by our 2006 graduates in preparation for their graduation.

275 Rosaries were made by our Rosary Club, which were sent to a mission in India, to those serving in our military, and to our school community.

Three 8th Grade students awarded the 2006 Knights of Columbus Serra Award for dedicated service to their parishes.

Approximately 50 of our students are involved in the Music Ministry program at their parishes.

Innovative Teaching Grants from the Miami Valley Education Council were presented to teachers Beth Allaire, Marsha Guerriero and Marie Raffio, and Betsy Harrison was awarded a Mac Grant.

Our faculty trained in website development and Smart Board operation as part of their professional development.

In total, our 8th grade graduates were awarded over \$28,400 in high school scholarships.

Terra Nova Achievement Test Scores indicate Bishop Leibold students are generally in the high range for academic and cognitive ability when compared with national norms.

BLS Catholic 8th Grade students performed far above the national Catholic 8th Grade average in "Catechism of the Catholic Church" of the Assessment of Catholic Religious Education (ACRE) Test.

Many of our graduates attending area Catholic high schools are placed into Freshman Honors English and/or Honors Math Classes.

In 2006, 100% of our Spanish language graduates were placed into Spanish II at our area Catholic high schools at the beginning of their freshman year.

Bishop Leibold Student Awards

W. Fahey and S. Fess were awarded the Akers and Krusling Scholarships for highest scores on the Bishop Fenwick Catholic High School Placement Test.

J. Imwalle was awarded the Knights of Columbus Chaplain Scholarship to attend Archbishop Alter High School. A. Hanson was awarded the Knights of Columbus Excellence in Religion Award.

N. Tromp and C. Short were awarded four-year renewable Academic Excellence Scholarships from Archbishop Alter High School in recognition of placing first and second in our 2006 graduate class.

J. Daley, S. Fess, J. Krug, and E. Marsh were awarded the Pope John Paul II Character Award. These high school scholarships are funded by the BLS Athletic Association.

C. Short was awarded the Alter High School Knights Council Leadership Award Scholarship.


H. Taylor was given the Christian Leadership Award Scholarship. A. Hansen and R. Busse were awarded the Pat Hein Scholarship.

Our 7th and 8th grade teams did well in districts and regionals in The Power of the Pen, an inter-scholastic writing program with over 7,500 students competing statewide. In 2006, 8th grader S. Fess won Fifth in the State, and W. Fahey won the Chrysler Young Writer Award, and Second in the State in 2005.

In 2005, 8th grader S. Castle advanced to the Scripps Howard Spelling Bee National Competition in Washington DC.

Tools for Schools awarded us \$15,000 in 2004 and again in 2005 for first place for patronage of stores and spirit competitions at the Dayton Mall. Our team effort was organized by the PTO.

Last year, CommUnity, the fundraising organization providing for the youth of both parishes, raised \$96,000 that was given to the School, the Athletic Association, the PTO, and Our Lady of Good Hope and St. Henry Youth Ministries.
