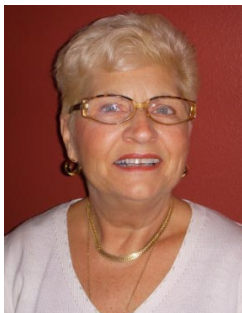


Speaker: Betty Will

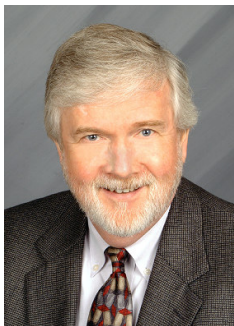


Speaker: Brian Lemoi

Robert K. Moriarty, S.M. directs the Pastoral Department for Small Christian Communities for the Archdiocese of Hartford. In addition to serving as an on-site pastoral resource to the parishes of the archdiocese, the department also publishes **Quest** and **Summer Reflections**, lectionary-based resources for small church communities. Bro. Moriarty serves as board member of the National Alliance of Parishes Restructuring into Communities. As a team member of the North American Forum on the Catechumenate, he has been part of the effort to design and present the three-day institute, *Imaging Initiation in Small Church Communities*. Bro. Presentation(s): Legislative Advocacy 101; One Family Under God

For the past six years, Chris West has worked as a community organizer for Catholic Relief Services in its Constituency Relations Support Unit. In this position he has worked with dioceses throughout the U.S., training Catholics to advocate effectively for more just policies that impact the poor overseas, e.g. reforming trade, foreign assistance, food aid, migration, the extractive industries and others. Because of the moral significance of U.S. immigration policy reform and its impact on the poor overseas whom CRS serves, CRS freed West to assume the position of Director of Field Operations for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Justice for Immigrants Campaign, where he served from April 2007 to October 2009. In this capacity, he coordinated activity between the legislative Capitol Hill staff and grassroots activists throughout the country. Chris also served as Interim National Campaign Manager for the Justice for Immigrant Campaign from Nov 2007 to April 2008.

Prior to joining CRS, West worked as a community organizer in northern Colorado with the Pacific Institute for Community Organization. He holds a BA in Human Services from Virginia Wesleyan College and is currently pursuing a Masters Degree in Communication in Contemporary Society, with an emphasis in Political Communication, at Johns Hopkins University.

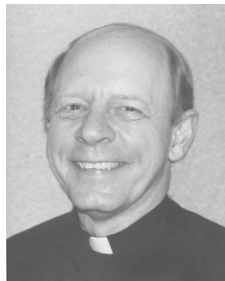

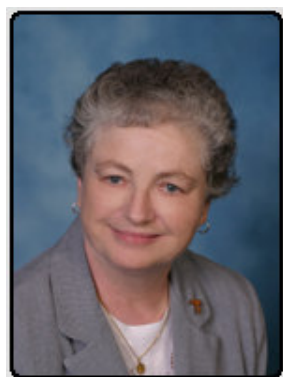

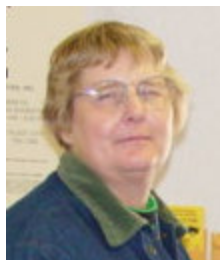
