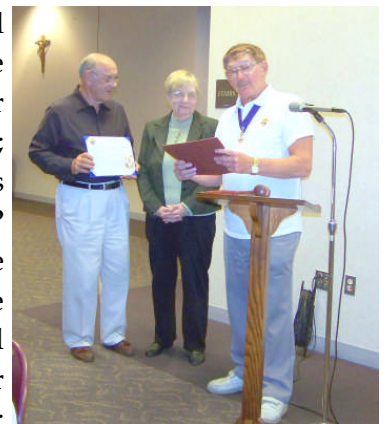

I "borrowed" this clip from the KofC web site, and thought I'd pass it along:

Two top rating firms have reaffirmed giving their highest ratings for the Knights of Columbus insurance program. Both A.M. Best and Standard & Poor's concluded this week that the 127-year-old Catholic fraternal order's financial strength and stability remains strong despite a slumping economy.

In my working career I have seen, and experienced 401K's take three severe losses as the economy went through its cycles. I've seen family members return to work after retirement due to 401K losses. They

can bounce back, but there are losses none the less. You might want to consider investing some of your future in the KofC annuities (rock solid) or even whole life insurance.
