

BACK TO SCHOOL DATES

School will begin on Monday, August 29th, with a half day from 8:30 -12:00. All parents are invited to enjoy coffee and donuts in our school hall beginning at 8:30 A.M provided by our P.T.O. Tuesday, August 30th will also be a half day followed by full days of school Wednesday, August 31st and Thursday, September 1st. No school on Friday the 2nd or Monday the 5th.

SCHOOL HOURS

Our regular school day will be 8:30 A.M. - 3:30 P.M.

Half days will be 8:30 A.M. - 12:00 P.M.

A two hour delay 10:30 A.M. - 3:30 P.M.

A two hour delay, while extremely rare, may be called due to weather conditions.

Two morning bells will ring at the start of each day. The 8:20 bell will call students together to go to their classrooms and prepare their materials for the start of the day. The 8:30 bell will announce the beginning of classes. Prayer will begin promptly at 8:30. Any student entering class after the second bell is tardy. Please have your child at school no later than 8:25.

Any student who is tardy 5 times will be marked 1/2 day absent.

WHERE TO GO ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

Students will gather in the school lobby until the bell at 8:20. 4th through 8th grade students will then be dismissed to their classrooms. Kindergarten through third grade students will be sent to the school hall before going to their classroom with their teacher.

SPECIAL NOTE TO KINDERGARTEN AND FIRST GRADE PARENTS

It is not unusual that one or two children at this age cry and refuse to join their classmates as they gather to go to the classroom. This can be a heart rending and frustrating experience for Mom or Dad. We have found that reluctant children become more adamant if Mom or Dad show reluctance to leave. Difficult as it may be, if your child has this problem, do leave him or her as the teacher begins to gather the class. Usually this is the best way to help your child adjust to his or her new challenge. We ask that parents do not follow their children to the classroom.

BUSSING FOR GIBRALTAR SCHOOL DISTRICT RESIDENTS

Please look in the local newspaper for the "Gibraltar Bus Schedules". If your children will be transported by Gibraltar buses, they may begin riding the bus on Tuesday, September 6th.

***All families are asked to fill out the Transportation form, this includes students who walk to school, ride a bus, or come by car. This information makes dismissal time easier.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL OF STUDENTS

If you are picking up or dropping off children here at school, you must do so in the rear of the building. This includes drop off for our preschool parents. Preschool parents should park in the front of the building for pick up. Only busses are to load and unload in the front of the building. For the safety of our students no exceptions will be made. Students will be dismissed from the school in two groups:

- * bus students in the front of the building
- * car/van students to the rear of the building

There will be one way traffic on the blacktop. Enter at the North gate and exit at the South gate (by the playscape). When parking on the blacktop, please pull in facing the fence, not the school, and drive **forward** to exit. It is difficult to see small children when backing up. We ask that all parents follow these directions to insure the safety of our children!

SCHOOL UNIFORMS

Students must be in uniform beginning September 6th. Students are to wear clothing appropriate for school before that date. Knee length shorts may be worn. If you have any questions about the dress code, please contact the school office. Girls' uniforms in plaid may only be purchased from former St. Mary's students or Schoolbelle Uniform Company. Uniform plaids are in stock at Schoolbelles, or you can order from schoolbelle.com. You may also order from Lands' End, at landsend.com/school, catalogs are available in the office. Please refer to the enclosed "Dress Code" for further details.

**Please note that the Dress Code for 7th and 8th grade students is different from K - 6th.

USED UNIFORMS

Uniforms will be available in the school hall beginning Monday, August 15th. These uniforms are free to anyone who can use them.

LATCH KEY

Latch Key will be available beginning on the first day of school, from 7:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. The cost is \$5.00 per hour for one child and \$3.00 for additional children. Latch Key information is available in the school office.

SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

We will continue the program started last year, students must order lunches and **pay for them in advance**. Order forms will go home with the newsletter every two weeks and should be returned by Friday of that week, we will again provide an envelope to use for lunch form and payment, please use that envelope. Any student who does not have a lunch and has not ordered one can get a peanut butter sandwich and a drink for that day. School lunches will be available beginning August 31st.

The cost of the school lunch is \$2.25 for all grades. Extra entrees will be \$.75 and must be ordered on the order form. Milk purchased alone will cost \$0.35 for white or chocolate.

The cost of lunch includes milk, which is considered a part of the school lunch. Fruit drink cannot be substituted unless a note is received indicating that your child has an allergy to milk products. **Please avoid dropping off fast food for your child.**

VISITOR POLICY

All visitors in the school building need to report to the office during the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. **Parents should not go with their child to the classroom.** School doors will be locked during these times and a school employee will open the door when a visitor rings the bell. This is not an attempt to keep parents from the building but an extension of our building security. Once a visitor has been checked into the building we will call for your child and the interruption to the classroom and the teacher will be minimal. All visitors will sign in and will be issued a visitor badge. Badges should be returned when signing out before leaving the building. The safety of your children is our number one concern and I appreciate your understanding of this policy.

LUNCH/RECESS SUPERVISORS

We are always looking for people to help supervise the lunch room and recess periods, both on a regular schedule and as subs. If you can help, please contact the school office. This counts for your service hours. A tuition credit of \$5.00 is given for **each full period** worked, from 11:30 until 1:10. Lunch Supervisors are required to follow our recess program and must sign in the office and wear a visitor pass.

If you are a new supervisor or wish to review our program, tapes are available in our school office. All supervisors must be knowledgeable of our lunch/recess program before working.

Requirements include:

- * knowledge of school program
- * review instructions for blood borne pathogens
- * criminal background check (ICHAT) - required by the Archdiocese of Detroit
- * attendance at Protecting God's Children workshop

ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Our School Advisory Committee is a vital part of our school. Meetings are scheduled once each month at 5:45 P.M. We are currently seeking parent representatives for each grade in our school. Members will discuss topics that include: formulating our school improvement plan, future enrollment, marketing, student recruitment. ST. MARY'S PARENT TEACHER ORGANIZATION

The Parent Teacher Organization is a group that meets monthly and provides special events for students and families. Our group relies primarily on the donations and volunteer service of our families. The organization is open to anyone who would like to volunteer their time and talents to positively enhance the school experience at St. Mary's.

PTO SCHOOL STORE

The school store will be open for viewing and purchasing on Monday and Tuesday the first week of school. Parents are invited to shop starting at 11:30 A.M. Students in seventh and grade will have the opportunity to work our school store. The store will be open for the students during the school day and all profits will go back to activities for the entire student body.

ST. MARY'S BOOSTER CLUB

St. Mary's teams are open to all of our parish and school children, neighboring parish students are also allowed to participate.

REQUIRED FUND-RAISERS

SCRIP

An average purchase of \$100.00 per month of Scrip for 10 months is required of all families. Scrip must be purchased by May 15th to be counted. Families who do not comply will be charged \$100. Families will receive half of the profit from their purchases in the form of a tuition credit. If you need more information about this program please feel free to call the school office.

RAFFLE TICKETS

\$200.00 of raffle tickets are given to each family. K-8 families are required to sell or buy these tickets. The raffle drawing will be held in the spring.

AUCTION

Our Annual Auction will be held November 5th, at the Grecian Center. Every family in our school is expected to make some donation to the Auction and also donate to the "Personally Priceless" items from each classroom. Proceeds from this event are used for our computer lab, instructional materials, and improvements to our entire curriculum.
