ITINERARY

Day 1 October 18, Thursday: Depart for Dublin

Depart Detroit and Chicago O'Hare International Airport for your overseas journey to Dublin via American Airlines.

Complimentary meals and beverages will be served aloft. (D)

Day 2 October 19, Friday: Arrive Shannon – Corrib River Cruise - Galway

Upon morning arrival at Dublin Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim your luggage, and a Peter's Way Tours tour manager/guide will meet you upon your exit from Customs. Board your comfortable touring bus and you will be on your way to Galway. Independent stop will be made en route to Galway for tea, coffee and scones.

Upon arrival in Galway, capital of the west and affectionately known as “The City of the Tribes,” we enjoy a Corrib Cruise.

This journey on the Corrib Princess takes passengers along the majestic River Corrib and onto the lake, providing visitors with wonderful views of the historic monuments and natural amenities that make this one of the most spectacular waterways in Ireland. Then, we drive along the shores of Galway Bay. Independent lunch. Continue for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Galway. (B,D)

Day 3 October 20, Saturday: Connemara, Kylemore Abbey & Knock - Sung Mass

Irish breakfast at your hotel. Travel through the Connemara Region en route to Kylemore Abbey. This is the country of *The Quiet Man* and *The Purple Taxi* – two famous films made in this region. It is an area full of contrast, granite mountains populated only by sheep, with hundreds of lakes forming a fisherman's paradise, and its seacoast with many sandy beaches. A tour takes us from Galway to the lake-dotted center of Connemara at Maam Cross.

Visit **Kylemore Abbey**, a Gothic-style castle built in the 19th century by a rich Liverpool merchant, which today belongs to the Benedictine Nuns. The entrance hall and three other rooms are open to the public. Restored by the nuns in a major restoration project, it can be described as a ‘cathedral in miniature’ and is very faithful to the so-called decorated style Church.

Informal singing at the Gothic Memorial Church. Independent lunch.

Continue to Knock. This little town is an important pilgrimage center and has been famous for over a century as the site of visions, apparitions, and miraculous cures. Knock Shrine contains a number of churches and shrines, including the modern Basilica and the Church of the Assumption. In 1879, an apparition of St. Mary, St. Joseph and St. John the Evangelist was recorded, later recognized as authentic. Since then, the place has attracted millions of pilgrims each year who gather in front of the Church's wall. The special message of Knock is the need for Penance.

Recitation of the Holy Rosary and Private Mass at the Chapel of the Apparition. Return for dinner and overnight at hotel in Galway. (B,D)

Day 4 October 21, Sunday: Galway Cathedral Mass - Burren Region - Cliffs of Moher - Evening/Medieval Castle Dinner

Irish breakfast at your hotel. **Attend the 9:00 am Mass at Galway Cathedral as sung by the St. Robert of Newminster Church Choir.** Afterward, enjoy an orientation tour of Galway, visiting the Spanish Arch, the main streets of the city, and ending at the Magnificent Cathedral of Galway. Independent lunch. Then, we drive through the most spectacular Burren Region. ‘Boirean’ is the Irish for ‘Rocky.’ It got its name from its polished limestone landscape. It is a glaciokarstic plateau with porous carboniferous limestone and shale systems. It is hard to believe that it was once lightly wooded and covered in soil. At the end of the Stone Age, nearly 6,000 years ago, farmers arrived. The farmers left their animals

grazing and this, along with natural weathering, stripped the soil of vegetation leaving this rocky landscape behind. Stop at Cliffs of Moher. The most majestic cliffs in Ireland rise from the Atlantic Ocean at 215 meters and extend for over seven kilometers. From this height, you can admire the Aran Islands, the Connemara Mountains and listen to the many sea birds that colonize this place from springtime on. Continue to hotel in Ennis or Limerick for check-in.

Evening Medieval Banquet at Bunnally Folk Park Castle or Knappogue Castle.

The world-famous medieval banquet is a testament to the cultural and social life of its former inhabitants. The ladies of the castle, aided and abetted by the Earl's butler, ensure an evening of entertainment, which follows in the best tradition of Irish hospitality. The wine flows as the entertainers recreate the magical atmosphere of the Earl's banquet through drama, music and song.

Informal recital at Bunnally Folk Park Castle or Knappogue Castle.

Overnight at hotel in Ennis or Limerick. (B,D)

Day 5 October 22, Monday: Dingle Peninsula –Tralee or Killarney

Irish breakfast at your hotel. This morning, head south through the Dingle Peninsula, the most northern of the Kerry Peninsulas. It is famous for its Celtic, pre-Christian monuments and Christian churches. It is also a ‘Gaeltacht’ (Irish speaking) area, where the Irish language and traditional ways of life are preserved. Dingle town itself is a thriving fishing town and offers plenty of opportunity for shopping or simply savoring the atmosphere of a typical country Irish town. Independent lunch en route.

The road around the Peninsula passes through a chain of Mountains, called Slieve Mish. From Inch, a long beach bordered by dunes and made famous by David Lean's movie *Ryan's Daughter*, admire the Iveragh Peninsula and Rossbeigh Beach. Drive around the coast to Sleah Head. Here, the blue of the marine landscape surrounds the Basket Islands, deserted since 1953. In the distance are the two rocky Skellig Islands, where the ruins of an early Christian Monastery can be found. The Dingle Peninsula will charm you with its villages painted in bright colors, and will bewitch you with the dramatic beauty of its landscapes. Continue to Tralee or Killarney for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Tralee or Killarney. (B,D)

Day 6 October 23, Tuesday: AM/Ring of Kerry – PM/Muckross House - Evening/Sung Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral in Killarney

After Irish breakfast, we tour the Ring of Kerry, the most famous and panoramic route in Ireland. En route around the Ring, take in spectacular scenery—mountains, peat bogs, lakes and magnificent views of the Atlantic Ocean, as you travel along the coast road. Leaving Killarney, pass through Killorglin, famous for its Puck Fair, then to Glenbeigh, where the cliff road affords panoramic views of the Dingle Peninsula and Dingle Bay. Continuing to Cahirciveen, you'll pass the birthplace of Ireland's national hero, Daniel O'Connell. Next, continue on through peat bogs to the town of Waterville. See Sneem Village, famous for its brightly colored houses.

The road, then, continues through the mountains to Moll's Gap and Ladies View, with superb views of the famous lakes of Killarney. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, visit **Muckross House and Gardens.** Built in 1843, this house is one of the most sumptuous residences in Ireland. Surrounded by beautiful gardens, it is in the heart of the Killarney National Park, the first such park opened in Ireland.

This evening, you will be transferred to St. Mary's Cathedral in Killarney for the scheduled evening Mass as sung by the St. Robert of Newminster Church Choir.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Killarney. (B,D)

Day 7 October 24, Wednesday: AM/Blarney Castle - Waterford - Kilkenny

Irish breakfast at your hotel. This morning, depart for County Cork to visit

Blarney Castle, where you will feel compelled to kiss the Blarney Stone and gain the gift of eloquence or as an 18th century French consul put it, "gain the privilege of telling lies for seven years." The castle itself, a tower house, dates from 1446. Stop for shopping at **Blarney Woollen Mills**, which sells high quality Irish crafts. Then we continue to the city of Waterford, which is the oldest city in Ireland. A walled city of Viking origin, it retains much of its medieval character together with the graceful buildings from its 18th century expansion. Visit the **Waterford Crystal Visitor Centre**. It occupies a 1.5-acre site on the mall in the heart of Waterford - a prime location set back just a hundred yards or so from the River Suir and the city's main quay, and bordering the city's Viking Triangle area. The new manufacturing facility includes highly skilled local craftsmen and produces 40,000 crystal pieces per year using traditional methods. The factory tour includes the following traditional production areas: wooden mould making, crystal blowing and furnace, quality inspection and finishing, crystal cutting, crystal sculpting and engraving, chandelier assembly and design inspiration. Independent lunch. Then, we continue to Kilkenny, the medieval capital of Ireland. It is the most interesting and best preserved of the medieval Irish cities. It owes its immense charm to the various impressive historical monuments. A medieval city of 24,000 people, it is characterized by many beautifully restored buildings and winding slipways ~ it is small and compact enough to explore on foot, yet full of fascinating historical buildings and contemporary shops, design galleries and restaurants. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Kilkenny. (B,D)

Day 8 October 25, Thursday: Kilkenny Castle - Glendalough - Mass at St. Patrick's Pro-Cathedral

Irish breakfast at your hotel. Begin our day with a visit **Kilkenny Castle**. One of the most instantly recognized buildings in Ireland, it has been an important site since it was built by the Anglo-Normans in the 12th century. This was a square-shaped castle with towers at each corner; three of these original four towers survive to this day. The Butler family bought the Castle in 1391 and lived there continuously until 1935. It has been restored to a Victorian period and its long gallery again houses portraits of the Butler family. The castle has an excellent guided tour, during which the visitor will learn about life in the castle over the many centuries of its existence.

Then, we leave Kilkenny to visit Glendalough, tucked away in the Wicklow Hills. It is a valley of two lakes, and a monastery of two Saints. The latter of the pair is St. Laurence O'Toole, one of the few Irish Saints to have been formally canonized. He was an abbot and builder of churches here in the 12th century before he became Archbishop of Dublin. But it is the earlier of the two - St. Kevin - whom we most associate with Glendalough, for he was responsible for the foundation of the monastery which expanded around his tomb after his death (allegedly at the biblical age of 120) around 618. The monastery has two foci - one at each of the two lakes in the valley. The upper one is simpler and more austere, evocative of the eremitical side of St. Kevin's life; the lower one has the more famous monuments - one of the best-preserved round towers in the country, the diminutive Priest's House, which is probably the Saint's tomb-shrine. Independent lunch en route. Continue to Dublin for hotel check-in.

Early evening, you will be transferred to St. Mary's Pro-Cathedral or at St. John & St. Augustine Church for the 5:45 pm Mass, sung by the St. Robert of Newminster Church Choir.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Dublin. (B,D)

Day 9 October 26, Friday: Highlights Tour of Dublin - Afternoon at Leisure - Evening/Farewell Dinner

Irish breakfast at your hotel. Today, we discover Dublin's 'Fair City.' This tour will allow you to take in all the sights, including the famous 'Doors of Dublin,' the elegant Georgian squares, and Phoenix Park. Highlights of the tour will be a visit to Trinity College to view the 8th century illustrated manuscript, *The Book of Kells*, followed by a visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ireland's largest Cathedral, which was built in 1213 and made famous by its former dean Jonathan Swift, author of *Gulliver's Travels*. The Chancel has ornate stained-glass windows, some by Harry Clarke, which are magnificent features. Independent lunch. Enjoy the afternoon at leisure in Dublin City.

We recommend a stroll down Grafton Street where you can enjoy the best in street entertainment and a coffee in Bewley's Café. The shopping is also great in this area of the city! Perhaps you will visit the Guinness Storehouse to see how this famous brewery was established and how the popular black brew is created. Enjoy a sampling.

This evening, enjoy dinner and entertainment at The Merry Ploughboy Pub. (The former show at Taylor's Three Rock has moved to a different venue in January 2007.) This is a state-of-the-art music venue open seven nights a week, all year round. Their lively show features contemporary Irish dancing and well-known guest artists. Fine food is a very important element. At The Merry Ploughboy Pub, youthful vibrancy has successfully combined with traditional craftsmanship to provide an excellent evening entertainment. Overnight at hotel in Dublin. (B,D)

Day 10 October 27, Saturday: Return from Dublin

Irish breakfast at your hotel. You will be transferred this morning by coach to Dublin Airport for your flight home. (B)

Triple rooms usually are regular twin or double-bedded rooms with a cot or rollaway bed added. Single rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of \$495.00. Moreover, Peter's Way Tours is not responsible for the denial of services by any carriers, hotels, restaurants, or other independent suppliers.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: From the time your deposit is received up to 130 days prior to departure, there is a \$250.00 nonrefundable cancellation fee per person. From 129 to 100 days prior to departure, the cancellation fee will be \$350.00 per person. For cancellations received from 99 days prior up to the day of departure the cancellation fee will be 100% of package price per person including taxes, fuel surcharges, single supplement, deviations fees and any other costs incurred (if applicable). (Travel insurance is offered as protection in case of illness, please see TRAVEL INSURANCE). **Tour participation is nontransferable. Names cannot be transferred on reservations or airline tickets.** Refund requests (if applicable) can only be honored when submitted in writing to Peter's Way Tours. All refund requests are subject to cancellation restrictions as set forth above. No refund will be made for any accommodations or services included in the tour that you do not use.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: All participants must have a valid passport. U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months, subsequent to return date. Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current requirements. It is solely the passenger's responsibility to ensure that all documents needed are completed and current. Peter's Way Tours will not be held responsible for lack of current and valid entry documents.

SERVICE CHARGES: All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave Euro 1.00 per person for the waiters after each meal; Euro 1.00 per person per day for the maid/bell boys.

TIPPING: For good work, recommended (but voluntary) tipping to your driver is Euro 2.00 per passenger per day; to the tour manager/guide Euro 4.00 per passenger per day, for the local guides Euro 1.50 per passenger per day. Tips for the bus driver and tour manager/guide are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. Other gratuities are usually handled individually.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: All passengers must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others as pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, climbing up/down stairs, etc. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. If special assistance is required, the passenger must travel with a companion willing and capable of providing any necessary assistance.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: It is strongly recommended that all participants buy insurance when they travel since the tour operator is not responsible for lost or damaged luggage or trip interruption. Peter's Way Tours offers an optional Passenger Travel Protection Plan. These benefits and services help insure the well being of the passenger while traveling worldwide. The plan payments are based on total package price, including departure taxes, fuel surcharges, single supplements, deviation fees, late charges, etc. The plan payment for total package prices from \$0 to \$2,100.00 is \$139; \$2,101.00 to \$3,000.00 is \$175.00; from \$3,001.00 and over is \$199.00. **If the plan payment is made at the time of deposit or within 10 days of receiving the Peter's Way Tours "Tour Deposit Acknowledgment Letter," the passenger will be covered for pre-existing conditions. However, the insurance plan can be purchased at anytime thereafter, excluding Coverage for pre-existing conditions, until final payment has been made.
