St. Helena Guild \$2,500.00 to \$4,999.99

St. Helena is responsible for the recovery of the True Cross of Christ.

"Vexilla Regis" Guild \$1,000 to \$2,499.99

The "Vexilla Regis" is a traditional hymn for the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross.

"Stabat Mater" Guild \$500 to \$999

The "Stabat Mater" is a traditional hymn dedicated to the Blessed Mother standing at the foot of the Cross.

As the "Mother Church" of a diocese, a cathedral in the Roman Catholic tradition is the center of Catholic life and the principal place of worship for the community of faith. It serves as the foundation for uniting parishes and is the symbol of their communion.

The bishop is the chief shepherd, pastor and teacher in a diocese with all its priests an extension of his ministry. Similarly, every altar upon which the Eucharist is celebrated in the diocese is an extension of the cathedral's altar.

The Cathedral is the home of the bishop's *cathedra*, the chair from which he teaches. The *cathedra* represents the bishop's authority by apostolic succession.

The Cathedral belongs to all. We expect the faithful of different parishes to come more frequently to visit their mother church and pray for the needs of the diocese and country.

A cathedral is a visible sign of our close communion with the See of Rome. We hope for a new sense of solidarity and oneness with the Holy Father the Pope, the head of the Catholic Church and co-operation in his universal mission.
