Accounts: We are hoping that our parish accounts will soon be available for publication. We shall need them to demonstrate to the Diocese our ability to finance the New Assembly Rooms.

Rumours & Counter Rumours. The Diocesan Building and Sites commission always ask the Parish Priest and the Architect to explain any plans for new building on Diocesan Trustee property. Fr. Philip asked your Chair of Buildings Committee, Leigh Hodges and his assistant Manager, John Carr to accompany them to this meeting. It was favourable and fair to say both the Bishop as Chair and members of the Committee greeted our plans with enthusiasm after questioning, BUT the next stage is to seek permission from the Historic Churches Commission and then the Diocesan Trustees to support with a loan. If all goes to plan we would then need to seek local Council planning permission before moving on site, so you can see we still need your prayerful support in our progress.

It was one of these Pontiffs of expertise who caught my attention when waiting for a green light just before Argos when he broadcast, "the Catholic belief in bread and wine becoming the Body & Blood of Christ is fatuous" I mentioned it over the lunch table to gauge reaction. You can imagine the consensus was indignation at such an attack on a fundamental truth. Me? I just feel it is the measure of work to be done in sharing the splendour of truth. Some things can only be learnt by Revelation, others by investigation. So this week the Daily Telegraph announced that if we were able to still read the paper on Wednesday after 8.30 am we would still be alive. Intrigued, I thought, I must enquire more. Breakfast TV was the answer were a Physics expert from Leicester University was reassuring that "collisions were happening all the time. No need to worry!" I thought "no wonder my car insurance keeps rising" until Professor Hawking reassured that we wouldn't be swallowed up by a black hole even if one was created. Yes we now have proudly bought a seventeen mile tunnel for £4.4 billion and after thirty years of construction, hope to eventually create the conditions which existed just after the Big Bang. First I am interested that the unproven theory of the "Big Bang" seems now to be acceptable fact. Strange bit of logic there don't you think when all science demands empirical evidence and proofs? Therein lays a different dilemma. When a man first arrived on the moon, I think he put things into perspective. No it wasn't his complaint that the step was too big (Do you remember, “One giant step for mankind etc....”) it was his vision of the world from a different perspective that made him quote the Book of Genesis; “In the beginning God and the Universe was a formless void And God saw it and indeed it was very good”. So are we wrong to use our enquiring and speculative powers? Not at all surely! Why even the Vatican has a Pontifical Commission for Science, regularly addressed by the Holy Father and strongly encouraged by him. No the Church has never found that the investigative sciences are in opposition. Quite the opposite! Reality is looked at from different approaches yet mutually complimentary. Einstein once spoke of “A rapturous amazement at the harmony of natural law, which reveals an intelligence of such superiority that, compared with it, all the systematic thinking and acting of human beings is an utterly insignificant reflection”. Perhaps the psalmist put it even better, “When I look at the stars, the work of Your hands, what is man that You keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him? Yet You have made him little less than a god, with glory and honour You surround him.” So let us develop our expertise by investigation for the good of humanity: but personally I think the real question is “What happened before the Big Bang?”
