

DRESS CODE

Students and parents are expected to have an attitude of cooperation, a concern for modesty and neatness when it comes to the dress code. Some clothing is inappropriate for the school setting. Any clothing that is distracting in the classroom will not be allowed. When this occurs the student will be sent to the office. Parents will be called and will have to provide a change of clothing before a student is allowed back in the classroom.

Logo clothing must be the official Sacred Heart of Jesus Logo provided by “Picture this Embroidery”.

The dress code begins on the first regular day of classes for students in grades 1-8. Teachers will check the dress code at the beginning of each day.

Pants: Navy blue cotton dress pants or corduroy pants are allowed. Denim, nylon, stretch, faded or ripped material is not allowed. Cargo or carpenter pants are not acceptable.

Skirts: Girls may wear pleated navy blue skirts. Skirts must be of an appropriate length which come to the knee.

Shorts: Navy blue shorts may be worn during the months of August, September, May, and June. Shorts must be an appropriate length which is no shorter than 2 inches above the knee.

Shirts: Light blue, red or white solid shirts may be worn. All shirts must be tucked in. Shirts must have sleeves and collars.

Shoes: Dress shoes or athletic shoes are to be worn.

Socks: Socks are to be worn at all times. Students may wear knee high socks.

Sweaters: Solid colors of red, white, or light blue may be worn.

Sweatshirt: The only sweatshirt allowed is the grey or red logo sweatshirt. This may be worn over a regulation shirt.

Jewelry: Dangling earrings and rings for other piercings are not appropriate in school. Boys may not wear earrings. Girls may wear earring that do not cause a distraction in the classroom.

Accessories: Belts, ties, purses, bracelets, and other adornments may be allowed at the discretion of the school. If you have questions about the appropriateness of an item of clothing, check with the principal.

Make-up: Lipstick is not to be worn. Lip gloss is acceptable.

Hair: Hair needs to be cleaned and well groomed. It needs to be kept out of the students eyes and should not cause a distraction. Students may not dye their hair.

Eighth grade students may wear may wear light colored khaki pants and shorts in addition to the pants listed above.

Jean's Day Dress

There are occasions when the dress code is relaxed and students may wear denim apparel.

- Jeans must be clean (not torn) and in good condition.
- All other aspects of the dress code listed above are still in force.
- Colored t-shirts with no graphics may be allowed as long as they have sleeves and midriffs are covered.

Mass Day Dress

When we attend Mass or other liturgical celebrations in church we are entering into the presence of God and should always look our best. Jeans are never allowed on these days. Students may dress in more formal, non-uniform clothing. Boys may wear ties and sport coats. Girls may wear dresses that come to the knees and cover the shoulders. This is not a Jean's Day. Guidelines will be given for specific events such as eighth grade graduation.

Dress for Physical Education (gym)

Students wear appropriate shorts and t-shirts to P.E. class. Solid colors should be worn. Shirts should not have logos or other messages on them. Clothing needs to be in good condition and not have holes.
