Serrans, seminarians, priests and guests ushered in the holiday season during what was described as 'one of the best Christmas parties yet.' Most Rev. Bishop William Winter, Rev. Joseph Mele, Serra Club Chaplain, and retired priests from St. John Vianney Manor joined the annual gathering to celebrate the Christmas Season in the brightly decorated Seminary dining room.



Msgr. Edward Burns, Rector of the Seminary, welcomed the group on behalf of Bishop David Zubik who was unable to attend the affair because of his commitment to celebrate Mass that evening on behalf of the Catholic Latin Community at St. Paul Cathedral. Msgr. Burns added that he was delighted to "be back home in Pittsburgh" following

his assignment with the National Council of Catholic Bishops.

Tables were laden with snacks that included hot and cold appetizers, shrimp plates, a sandwich ring, fresh fruit, cookies and cakes, salads, chips and dips all of which were consumed with a variety of wines, soft drinks, tea, and coffee. The food and drink was donated by Serrans. Members of the Seminary's kitchen staff did an outstanding job of tending to the needs of guests all evening.

The evening closed with all of the seminarians and priests present singing *Salva Regina* - a hymn traditionally sung by all of the seminarians as part of their evening prayers. Serran Nunzio Galetta photographed the event.

The Seminary maintenance staff provided by Ms. Mary Ironside, consisted of Ms. Joann Likavee, our kitchen helper, and two parking attendants who worked through the cold and blowing snow to provide first class valet service. November meeting Wrap Up

Our speaker at the November 21st luncheon was Msgr. Edward Burns who recently returned from his duties in Washington, D.C. as Executive Director of the Secretariat for Vocations and Priestly Formation for the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. He has been in Washington since 1999.

Msgr. Burns, now Rector of St. Paul Seminary, spoke of a new document soon to be released by the Pope that will strengthen the Seminary Program. Part of Msgr. Burn's duties were to help rewrite the Program on Formation.

In his talk, Msgr. Burns reported the following statistics: average age entering seminary is 37; Number of priests ordained yearly is 500 - 515; 75% of seminarians were altar servers; 65% were lectors or Eucharistic Ministers; and 100% were invited by priests. These statistics show that vocations are right under our noses. Seminarians all speak of having a deep level of hearing God's call. Some do not complete the program but all admit they became better men as they leave.

This year, 76 parishes have asked for Seminarians to visit and speak to their congregations. †

Memorial Mass is a Special Tradition

Through the kindness of Father John A. Sweeney, Pastor, we were again privileged to hold our Memorial Mass and Luncheon at his beautiful Church, St. Bonaventure, Glenshaw, PA on November 7, 2008.

Father Joseph M. Mele was the celebrant of the Mass. During his homily, he praised members of the Pittsburgh Serra Club for remembering the approximately 140 members who have died since the Club's inception in 1943, especially Joseph J. McCann who died in August of this year. Fr. Mele was assisted in the mass by Jack Warwick, server, Tom Politylo, lector, and James Finn, minister of the cup. Ray and Emma Golebie were the Gift Bearers. Ms. Shari Whitico, the church organist, provided the music.

At the Mass, following Communion, Fr. Mele and John Pillar inducted five new members into the Club.

Approximately sixty members and guests including ten widows of Serrans attended the Mass and Luncheon. President John Pillar welcomed the group, especially the widows, after lunch presented each widow with a red rose, a tradition with the club. The lunch was delicious, prepared by the caterer, Audrey Burgeon, assisted by Norman McDonald, husband of Serran Mary Kay, who has graciously volunteered his services for the past seven years. †

The Serra Scholarship Trust Fund

One of the Pittsburgh Serra Club's early members, Peter Mills, established a Scholarship Trust Fund with gifts totaling \$20,000. It was, he said, something that "offers one of the best and surely the most lasting means of fulfilling the

first objective of our Club, the promotion of vocations to the priesthood. Because of this trust, our efforts will continue long after we are gone.”

The Club encourages Memorial Gifts to the Trust Fund at the time of death of a relative or friend. Memorial Gift cards, are available from the Club secretary. Each year, Serra member Elise Bennett sends a request to all Serrans for donations to the Trust Fund and we thank her for her fine effort.

As of the last fiscal year end, June 30, 2008, the Serra Scholarship Trust Fund, held and administered by the Diocese of Pittsburgh, had a principal balance of \$393,036. The income generated by this fund is used by the Diocese for tuition, room and board and vocation programs related to the education of men to the priesthood. The fund generated income of \$22,652 in the last fiscal year.

It has been the practice, when the Club’s annual donations reach the amount of \$10,000, a check for this amount is given to the Bishop at our annual Ordinati Dinner. This amount is then added to the Fund’s principal held and invested by the Diocese.

As of December 31, 2008, our annual donations now total \$5680. If you haven’t responded to the Club’s annual appeal and wish to do so, please make your tax deductible donation with a check payable to the Serra Scholarship Trust Fund, and mail it to the Serra Club of Pittsburgh, 2900 Noblestown Road, Pittsburgh PA 15205. **Let’s try to reach the \$10,000 goal by the next Ordinati Dinner in August 2009.** †
