**St. Patrick Sacramental Policies**

**Baptism**

1. Parents must be registered and attend Mass at St. Patrick for 3 months *before* preparation.
2. Parents must attend Baptism Preparation class. Godparents are invited to attend the class. Please schedule in advance with the Church secretary.
3. Out of town Godparents must provide a letter from their own pastor as to their suitability to exercise this office.

**Sacrament of Marriage**

1. Couples must contact the pastor *at least* 4 months (preferably more) prior to the desired wedding date.
2. Couples must complete FOCCUS inventory and participate in a pre-Cana course or marriage-prep weekend.

### How many abortions occur?

According to the Alan Guttmacher Institute, in 2005 the number of abortions that took place in the United States was 1.21 million. Some 42,350 of these occurred on women who were 16 to 20 weeks pregnant; over 13,310 occurred on women who were 21 weeks or more into their pregnancy. In 2004 there were 96,890 abortions on women who had had three or more previous abortions. From 1973 through 2005, more than 45 million legal abortions occurred in our country. No other single cause accounts for more deaths.

### Why do people get abortions?

Abortions are done mostly for non-medical reasons. As the abortion industry itself admits on the website of the Alan Guttmacher Institute, "*three-fourths say they cannot afford a child; three-fourths say that having a baby would interfere with work, school or the ability to care for dependents; and half say they do not want to be a single parent or are having problems with their husband or partner.*"
